## 2011-2012 WINTER BULLSEYE PISTOL LEAGUE

- DATES:** Thursdays, October 20<sup>th</sup> through March 15<sup>th</sup> (No League on Nov.24<sup>th</sup>)
- TIME:** First Relay Starts @ 3:30 pm, 8 relays will be fired.
- COURSE OF FIRE:** 22 & CF National Match Courses (NMC), one target each of Slow Fire, Timed Fire and Rapid Fire on alternate relays. You may fire a 22 during the CF match.
- ORIENTATION:** Thursday, October 20<sup>th</sup> will be for registration and practice. There will be no firing for record. Orientation for new shooters will be Tuesday, Oct. 25<sup>th</sup> and Nov. 1<sup>st</sup>.
- RULES:** NRA rules will apply. Scoring will be by competitors. Differences will be settled by jury. Competitors may sign up for only 2 relays (1 relay if shooting only one gun). After these relays, competitors are welcome to sign up for more relays if there is space & others are not waiting.

- AWARDS:** Plaques or NRA points. Match winner may not be a class winner. A min. of thirteen (13) scores are required to qualify for awards. No more than 20 scores accepted. The top ten (10) scores shall be used to determine awards. It is your choice of what scores you turn in. If you don't have an NRA classification, one will be assigned based on table below. The average of your first five .22 scores will be used to establish your classification.

Each class requires 3 qualifying shooters for a 1<sup>st</sup> place award, five (5) qualifying shooters for a 2<sup>nd</sup> place award, and eight (8) qualifying shooters for a 3<sup>rd</sup> place award. Match winner cannot be a class winner.

## **Revolver League**

AR&PC shall run a handicapped revolver league congruent with the summer Bullseye League. The league shall consist of ten standard matches .

The basic rules are as follow:

Any smokeless powder revolver of .45 cal or less can be used.

The same revolver must be used throughout the league.

The average of the ten scores plus the handicap shall be used to determine awards.

If the participant is shooting the winter bullseye league, they may substitute the revolver for either gun used in the league with no additional cost.

There is an additional \$5.00 charge if the participant wishes to shoot revolver in addition to the two guns used in the bullseye league.

One Gun = \$30.00 (22cal or C.F.)

Two Gun = \$40.00 (22 & C.F.)

Revolver Only = \$20.00

One Gun & Revolver League = \$30.00

Two Gun & Revolver League = \$45.00

**NEW SHOOTER ORIENTATION**

- PURPOSE:** To give new shooters an opportunity to learn the rules, commands, and procedures of Bullseye shooting before competing in the regular league sessions. Safe handling of firearms will be emphasized. Shooters will be able to shoot one or more relays to get a feel for the sequence of the gallery course of fire. Note that these are not intended to be "how to shoot" sessions, but the experienced shooters may well offer such advice.
- WHEN:** Oct. 24<sup>th</sup> and Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> , 6:30PM – 7:30PM
- EQUIPMENT:** Bring your pistol (with iron or optical sights), 1 or more magazines (2 recommended), a case or box for the pistol, good eye and ear protection, and about 100 rounds of ammunition as approved for the AR&PC range. If you have an empty-chamber indicator for your pistol, bring it as well. We will furnish makeshift indicators for those who have none. A telescope or field glasses are useful, but not strictly necessary.  
We strongly recommend that all shooters begin with a .22 pistol.
- REMINDERS:** Firearms are to be kept unloaded at all times unless the command to load has been given during the course of a match. All firearms are to remain cased prior to the start of a match until permission to handle your firearm is given by the range officer. During a match, firearms must be left on the shooting bench with the slide back or cylinder open, and an empty-chamber indicator in place, or in your pistol box, unless permission to handle firearms has been given. Anytime the range officer calls "cease fire", all shooting **MUST** stop.
- VOLUNTEERS:** Experienced bullseye shooters are encouraged to participate in the orientation sessions to help bring new shooters up to speed on match procedures.
